PARTICIPANTS	Mean Age (range)	Average age at which language exposure began (range)
Early English (<i>n</i> =41) <i>Typically hearing</i>	4;9 (2;11 - 6;7)	Birth
Later English (<i>n</i> =28) Deaf & Hard of Hearing with hearing aids, CIs, or BAHA	5;0 (3;5 - 6;8)	Approx. 15 months (0-60 months) 25/28 (89%) exposed by ~24 months





Finding 1: Deaf, Hard-of-Hearing, and typically hearing children acquire vocabulary at equivalent rates (parallel slopes).

Finding 2: However, language access that begins AFTER BIRTH creates barriers to developing age-appropriate receptive vocabulary (PPVT raw scores).

<u>UPSHOT</u>: Aspects of development that depend on a language foundation might not wait for children to catch up (e.g., Number Cognition, Executive Function, Theory of Mind)
